LOS ANGELES, CA (October 20, 2015)—The Annenberg Space for Photography today announced a series of special events and programs inspired by the exhibition LIFE: A Journey Through Time, on view at the Photography Space through March 20, 2016. The exhibition presents a photographic interpretation of life on Earth from the Big Bang to the present by acclaimed National Geographic photographer Frans Lanting. Based on Lanting's epic, multi-year project, LIFE explores the story of our planet from its earliest beginnings to its present diversity, captured in over 70 images that evoke the complex wonder of nature through time.
